ALLARD JOINS SENATE COLLEAGUES TO BUILD TWO HABITAT FOR HUMANITY HOMES WILL HELP BUILD HOME IN LOVELAND ON MARCH 17th

Washington, D.C. – U.S. Senator Wayne Allard (R-CO), Chairman of the Senate Housing and Transportation Subcommittee, on Wednesday morning traded in his suit for overalls in order to help Habitat for Humanity construct two homes in a Washington, D.C. suburb.

“I am a strong supporter of Habitat for Humanity,” Allard said while hammering nails into wooden boards. “There is nothing more special than owning your own home. Habitat for Humanity makes it possible for people who otherwise would never be able to own their own home to achieve their dream of home ownership.”

Allard’s next Habitat for Humanity project will be in Colorado on March 17th in Loveland, Colorado. Allard, along with local and state lawmakers will gather at 1177 Raven Place in Loveland to conduct a groundbreaking and begin work on the “House the Senate Built” for Colorado.

Last year, U.S. Senator Sam Brownback (R-KS) and Allard were the primary sponsors of S. 319, legislation to encourage the Senate to participate in the “House the Senate Built” project in the Washington, D.C. area. In addition, the legislation encouraged Senators to participate in a project in their home state. Allard selected has selected Loveland to be his “House the Senate Built” project for the state of Colorado.

“I want to encourage everyone to come out and join us on March 17th,” added Allard. “There is no greater feeling in the world than helping someone realize their dreams.”
