ALLARD SAYS HIS THOUGHTS ARE WITH AMERICAN TROOPS SAYS HE REMAINS CONCERNED ABOUT MISSION

Washington, D.C. — U.S. Senator Wayne Allard (R-CO), a member of the Senate Armed Services Committee, said today that he remains concerned about the long-term success of the NATO air strike on Serbia Yugoslavia, and he is convinced that ultimately American ground forces may be deployed into Yugoslavia.

“Since the bombing has begun, my thoughts and prayers have been with our brave men and woman who are currently engaged in this mission,” Allard said. “I remain concerned about the Clinton administration’s policy to intervene in a civil war of another country, and to do so with the offensive use of NATO, a strictly defensive military alliance. I also remain convinced that we may ultimately be looking at American ground troops in Yugoslavia, a prospect that concerns me greatly.”
