COLORADO SENATORS RANKED NUMBER ONE IN LEGISLATION ENACTED DURING 106th CONGRESS CAMPBELL AND ALLARD PASS 16 BILLS

Washington, D.C. – According to records recently released by the Library of Congress, Colorado Senators Ben Nighthorse Campbell and Wayne Allard were ranked number one in the U.S. Senate in the number of bills enacted into law during the 106th Congress.

During the two year session of the 106th Congress, the two Colorado lawmakers combined to have 16 bills signed into law. Senator Campbell had 12 bills signed into law, Senator Allard had 4 bills signed into law. The survey individually placed Campbell as the number one ranking Senator for bills passed and Allard as the number ten ranking Senator out of the 100 members of the Senate.

“No one ever passed a bill alone,” said Senator Campbell. “A lot of the credit for the successful legislation goes to our Congressional colleagues, and especially to the House members of the Colorado Congressional Delegation who saw the value in these bills and helped further many of them.”

“For the Colorado delegation to rank number one in the U.S. Senate in getting legislation enacted into law is a tremendous accomplishment and demonstrates what a great team we have representing Colorado in the U.S. Senate,” added Senator Allard.

Senator Allard’s legislation enacted into law included his bill to create the Spanish Peaks Wilderness Area in southern Colorado and the Great Sand Dunes National Park bill to create the nation’s newest national park in the San Luis Valley.
