ALLARD EXPRESSES DISAPPOINTMENT IN CLINTON VETO OF TAX BILL SAYS HE WILL WORK TO MAKE SURE SURPLUS IS USED TO PAY DOWN DEBT.

Washington, D.C. – U.S. Senator Wayne Allard (R-CO) today said he was “disappointed” at President Clinton’s veto of the \$792 billion tax relief bill.

“I am very disappointed in President Clinton’s veto,” Allard said. “More importantly, I am disappointed that working Coloradoans are not going to get any tax relief this year. If we can not afford to give the America people a tax cut now, when can we give them one?”

Allard also said that since it is clear that President Clinton will not give the America people tax relief this year, he is going to make sure the surplus goes toward repaying the debt.

“My efforts now will turn toward stopping President Clinton from spending the surplus,” added Allard. “If we are not going to give the American people tax relief at this time, I am going to make sure that surplus is used to pay down the debt. In the future I plan to continue to fight for tax relief”
