SENATOR ALLARD TO PARTICIPATE IN DEDICATION OF “HOUSE THE SENATE BUILT” ON SUNDAY IN LOVELAND COLORADO SENATOR AND WIFE HELPED BUILD HABITAT FOR HUMANITY HOUSE

Loveland, CO - U.S. Senator Wayne Allard (R-CO), Ranking Member of the Senate Housing and Transportation Subcommittee, and his wife Joan, will help dedicate the “House the Senate Built” in Loveland at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, December 9, in Loveland. The dedication will take place at 1177 Raven Place.

The “House the Senate Built” is a partnership between the United States Senate and Habitat for Humanity International. The project is an effort to strengthen neighborhoods and communities by building affordable homes with a low-income families. The goal of the project is to have members of the U.S. Senate build houses in all 50 states, together with local Habitat for Humanity volunteers and the homeowner families.

This summer, Senator Allard and his wife Joan helped in the construction of the home. The Colorado home is the first home outside of the Washington, D.C. area to be dedicated in the program.

Allard, who as a member of the Senate Housing and Transportation Subcommittee has made affordable housing a top legislative priority, sponsored a resolution with Kansas Senator Sam Brownback to create the program.
